
COVER STORY: Karishma Kapoor & Jayesh Ranjan Inaugurates Extramile

Preemies Stats in India

- Newborn deaths account for
 40% of all deaths among
 children under five years of age.
- India has **1/5th** of the world's preterm babies.
- In India, 3,341,000 babies are born **too soon** each year and 361,600 children under five die due to direct **preterm complications.**

Why ExtraMile?

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- The majority of neonatal deaths (75%) occur during first week of life, which is contributed not only by prematurity but also various spectrum of newborn disorders, which are treatable if addressed timely.
- There are many government organizations and NGOs which are working for the cause. But that is not sufficient! We need to go Extra Mile
- We will be associated with all those institutes and health care facilities providing Quality Care' and 'Time Referral & Transport' to the higher and more equipped centres.
- We will be sharing the load of finances for providing equitable care and will be working on innovative private-public partnership models at district and sub district health facilities.
- We will also partner with various educational institutions for spreading awareness for the cause.

Cost for Preemies Care

- According to Born Too Soon: The Global Action Report on Preterm birth and The WHO, India tops the list of 10 nations contributing 60% of the world's premature deliveries.
- This comes with need of expertise, infrastructure and huge cost of care for intensive care treatment of such babies, needing high end ventilators, drugs, disposables, parenteral nutrition and 24X7 constant monitoring needing sufficient
- Human Resources which includes trained doctors and nurses!
- This is huge economic burden and needs to be shared.

Case Stories

Baby of Deep Kaur Sahani Twins, Preemie with blood & brain Infection

Preterm baby of 26weeks and birth weight 800gm got discharged but got re-admitted with blood infection and brain infection.

Due to lack of finances Extramile supported the baby for 2 weeks of IV antibiotics and other supportive medications.



Baby of Tabassum, surgical intervention through Extramile



The Preemie, baby of tabassum fatima was admitted due to a complicated herniotomy. ExtraMile along with other parents helped this baby to undergo the surgery and provide financial aid.

Baby of Jhansi, Ventriculoperitoneal Shunt, A Brain surgery

This Preemie baby was admitted at Soumya Children's Hospital for Ventriculoperitoneal Shunt (VP shunt), a brain surgery to remove excess water. ExtraMile came to the aid of this baby to undergo the surgery and save life.

Case Stories

Baby of Anjum Fatima, Pneumopericardium and pneumothorax

Baby of Anjum Fatima was born full term and developed infection on Day 3 of life for which he had to be ventilated. He reached Rainbow Hospital in a state of bradycardia and poor oxygenation and was diagnosed to have pneumopericardium and pneumothorax, with pulmonary hypertension.



This baby required the maximum support

in the form of highest ventilator (HFO) and gas treatment (nitric oxide), which comes with a huge cost. They came to me one day saying they are exhausted with finances. Extra Mile helped to let this baby not go off hospital and contribute to finances for the last few days of treatment!

Twin Babies of lipipuspa, Premature at 28 weeks weighing 1080 &1180 gm



Twin babies of lipipuspa, who were born extremely premature at 28 wks with birth weight of 1080gm and 1180 gm at Paramitha Hospital, Hyderabad. Their Father's name is Ashesh, who works as operator at Jenex battery company. While their mother, Pushpa is a house wife and this family belongs to Orissa. It was a very precious pregnancy for parents after many

years of married life but could not afford treatment for preterm care. Extra miles helped them to bear with the cost of treatment. Both the babies are doing well and discharged home at 1.5kg. Thanks to the whole team for supporting these babies.

Case Stories

Preemie with persistent hypoglycemia

This baby was born at 36wks and birth weight of 1.6kg, came to us around 13 days from warangal, with persistent hypoglycemia (low sugar levels), was on CPAP (small ventilator) and was completely encephalopathic (poor activity and delayed brain responses). The cause of hypoglycaemia was not known. Finally we could find the reason was severe infection in blood (blood culture positive sepsis)



Once treated well with antibiotics, this baby developed feed intolerance which increased his stay at hospital because we had to start IV nutrition. He is now with normal sugar levels and improved sepsis.

Preemie of Farheen, NICU Care for 29+3 wks



Baby of Farheen is Preterm with 29+3 wks. Extra Mile helped them with financial aid which gave them 1 week of NICU care.

Baby of Sneha reddy, Critically ill & still needs NICU care.



Baby of Sneha Reddy is critically ill and still needs nicu care. Parents are not able to cope up with finances. Extramile helped them with a few days of intensive care treatment.

Premature baby of Ayesha, Two months of hospital stay

Baby of Ayesha was extremely premature at 28wks and birth weight being 900gm got discharged home. After two months of hospital stay and weight increasing to 1.5kg, we helped them by going an extra mile towards the end when they completely exhausted their finances.



Founder's Note

Way beyond 8 years, in 2014, when my mentor Dr. Dinesh Chirla requested me if I can go for weekly once to a clinic which helps orphanages with regular health checks, as a part of initiative run by Heal a Child Foundation. I never knew this would change my life.

I started getting attached to many such foundations and this gave me immense pleasure. It continued for many years and with a group of friends I helped many children where ever, whatever and whenever we got a chance

Then, in 2018, a baby from Nagpur got admitted in NICU. There was a cyst in his belly and also a hole in his stomach. They couldn't bear the financial strain. All our team at Rainbow Children's Hospital, took a combined decision to save the baby and I took initiative to arrange finances.

With each passing day, many such underprivileged newborns came to my unit who needed intensive care treatment but couldn't afford financially or do not have proper awareness. All these thoughts took 3 long years to accomplish "ExtraMile". I approached few friends, who believed in me and agreed to be on board with me and some became members and that's how we all registered our trust on 1st October,2021.


